Issues and Considerations for AA Volunteers @ the Cole County Jail

Please be aware this is a secure confinement facility. Security, control and safety are primary considerations that have to be taken into account when entering the jail.

Paul Bergfeld, Corrections Chair, is the primary contact for District 11; contact can be made @ 573-761-4772 or email: bergfeldp10@yahoo.com. You can go to the AA Dist 11 site- <http://aadistrict11missouri.org/> to see this info as well under events and service opportunities. All volunteers must be screened by him, given an orientation and then approved by the Cole County Jail staff. This approval will include a criminal record check.

- Volunteers may be subject to search prior to entry into the jail, including metal detector wand.
- No weapons of any kind, including pocket knives of any size, nail clippers and so forth.
- Only stick type ball point pens allowed, no pencils, no click type pens, no roller balls pens, etc.
- No cell phones.
- No money.
- No hardback books, i.e. Big Book, 12 & 12, Daily Reflections must be soft bound. No metal bindings, spiral notebooks, glossy publications, pamphlets with staples, etc.
- Only approved literature can be left with the offender. Where and When, AA Pamphlets and the like. Again no staples and prior approval from Cole County Jail Staff is required.
- **Do Not** accept anything from an offender, i.e. mail, cards, gifts, etc.
- **Do Not** promise to contact anyone on behalf of the offender or make any other promises.
- **Do Not** become overly familiar with the offenders or engage in hugging. Hand shake is acceptable.

The following conditions will exclude people from being AA volunteers.

- Anyone currently under probation or parole supervision.
- Anyone with pending criminal charges.
- Anyone who is registered criminal offender.
- Anyone who is serving a sentence in the Cole County Jail, i.e. weekend time, shock time, etc.
